## **SGOOD 2.0 Overview**

### **Course Description**

The Governance for Outstanding Organisation Directors (SGOOD) Programme, developed in collaboration with National Council of Social Service (NCSS), is designed to:

- meet the learning needs of board members serving in nonprofit organisations (NPOs);
- provide a comprehensive understanding of non-profit governance, equipping directors with the knowledge, strategies, and best practices needed to drive effective leadership and organizational sustainability;
- practical and strategic approach to strengthening governance and enhancing the impact of NPOs.

### **Key Components**

- E-learning Modules: 10 modules specifically developed for nonprofit sector
- In-Person Learning Day: Twice a year where participants learn from experts and each other
- Receive a SGOOD 2.0 Completion Certificate, recognised by SGX RegCo as one of four approved directorship programmes that fulfils mandatory training requirements via LED Bridging Pathway




